In coordination with the Joseph Campbell Foundation, a new collaboration is under way between the New York Public Library, OPUS, and Pacifica regarding the Joseph Campbell papers, which are now centralized in NYPL's Manuscripts and Archives Division, making them accessible to a consortium of many colleges and research libraries as well as to Pacifica. The Joseph Campbell personal library, lecture recordings, and artifacts all remain with OPUS on the Pacifica campuses. We look forward to these collaborations and the possibilities for joint programs, research, and curating exhibits on the East and West coasts, as well as in Europe.

Devon Deimler received her MA and is currently a PhD Candidate in Mythological Studies at Pacifica. Her dissertation adopts Jame Hillman's idea of depth psychology as a depth aesthetics by considering Dionysos as an archetype of aesthetic experience. Before studying at Pacifica, Devon received her BA in Interdisciplinary Sculpture from the Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, focusing on event-based work and modern

through contemporary art and film history. She has assisted in several arts-related archives and her experience in art and music includes founding an independent record label and collaborative event project, Wildfire Wildfire Productions, and working as Assistant to the Director at the Dennis Hopper Art Trust.

At OPUS, Devon is working within the collection management database to refine collection description and will be developing rotating archival exhibits. Our next event will be on Sunday, January 8, 2017 at the Pacifica Graduate Institute Ladera Lane campus. Come hear Dr. Catherine Svehla as she leads an interactive exploration of storytelling in a talk entitled:

Once Upon A Time Is Now

In traditional cultures, people come together to listen to the old stories and consider thei wisdom and meaning for the present moment. This practice is one of our oldest medicines and teaching forms, one that we still need and can use today to gain insight into cultural and personal concerns. Join Catherine Svehla, Ph.D. for the telling and exploration of the story that we need right now. We'll use a simple divination method to guide us to the story that needs to be told to the group that gathers.

Dr. Catherine Svehla is an independent scholar, educator, and artist with a PhD in Mythological Studies and Depth Psychology from Pacifica Graduate Institute. She creates story-based classes and programs geared toward a popular adult audience that demonstrate the relevance of mythology to contemporary life. Dr. Svehla is the founder of Mythic Mojo and the host of Myth in the Mojave, a bi-weekly podcast with an international audience. She founded and led the High Desert Mythological Roundtable from 2009-2015. In 2010, Dr. Svehla received a New Mythos grant from OPUS Archives for "Blisters On the Way to Bliss: Toward a New Understanding of Heroism," a project in the Joseph Campbell archives.


Wanted: Audio Players
