
With the fall semester upon us, OPUS wants to remind those working on their dissertations that the application period for the 2019 Christine Downing Dissertation Fellowship remains ongoing and the deadline is January 3, 2019 at 5:00 pm. Students in an accredited graduate program at any institution whose studies include a focus on depth psychology and/or mythology are eligible.

Sadly, in July we lost an esteemed mentor and inspiration to many, Marion Woodman. Marion, whose rich body of life's work focused on the relationship of psyche and soma, especially in the experiences and lives of women, lives on and continues to resonate for us through her archives at OPUS. In her honor, a memorial exhibit is currently on display through September and although modest, it reflects the depth and breadth of her passions. Then in January 2019, OPUS will participate in a special two-day memorial gathering sponsored by Pacifica and the PGI Alumni Association.

And if you haven't already had the opportunity, our exhibit *Passages Through the Archives: Midnight of Noon*, remains on view through November during regular business hours.

We are honored to have Christine Downing, PhD as our featured speaker for the fall Joseph Campbell Foundation Mythological RoundTable® Group. Dr. Downing, whose

collection is held in the Archives, will present "Walking in Freud's Footsteps: Along the Freud Promenade in the Dolomites" and group leader Devon Deimler will facilitate the discussion.

"Walking in Freud's Footsteps: Along the Freud Promenade in the Dolomites"

with Christine Downing, PhD

In this RoundTable presentation and slideshow, Dr. Christine Downing will interweave personal family history, her engagement with Freud and Jung, and their engagement with each other. It will also touch on connections between the personal and professional materials included in her collection housed in our Archives.

Dr. Downing helped to develop and is a core faculty member in Pacifica Graduate Institute's Mythological Studies program. Over her career, she has made significant scholarly contributions to the fields of Religious Studies, Mythology, and Gender Studies through a unique blending of rigorous scholarly work with the personal voice of

biographical writing and self-reflection. She earned an undergraduate degree in literature from Swarthmore College and PhD in Religion and Culture from Drew University, where she was the first woman to receive a doctorate. She was appointed the first woman president of the American Academy of Religion in 1974 and is Professor Emeritus in Religious Studies from San Diego State University, where she taught for almost twenty years. She has also taught at the San Diego campus of the California School of Professional Psychology and at the C.G. Jung Institute in Zurich. Dr. Downing has published and edited many books, including *The Goddess: Mythological Images of the Feminine*.








Exhibit On View

Passages Through the Archives: Midnight of Noon



OPUS is accepting applications for the Christine Downing Dissertation Fellowship. The Downing Fellowship is an annual scholarship awarded to dissertation students of any accredited graduate level institution in the fields of depth psychology and mythology. The Fellowship carries the name of Professor Downing in acknowledgement of her contribution to the fields of depth psychology and mythology, her many years of teaching at Pacifica Graduate Institute, and her gift to OPUS of her own archival materials. The purpose of the Downing Fellowship is to award \$5,000 for dissertation research in the Archives.
